What is the requested interpretation? Property @ 1793 S. Schorner Creek Rd. needs water service. Requesting a hook up to do a draw of 80 many gallons a day to a holding tank. We cannot get water any other way. See attached letter from well drilling company.

The director has the authority to consider the request for an interpretation, and shall respond within 30 days following the date of the request, as to whether or not a requested interpretation will be issued. The director may issue or decline to issue a requested interpretation. The director's decision to decline to issue an interpretation is final when the decision is mailed to the party requesting the interpretation. The decision to decline to issue an interpretation is not subject to local appeal.

After meeting and looking at your property, there is no space for our drill rig to set up and stay far enough from the septic drain field and areas where the mud flow would infiltrate the water that runs down to the creek and cause legal problems with the Department of Fish and Wildlife. I recommend that you contact Lincoln City and ask for a hook up to their system due to the difficulties that you have with your property.
