3	A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN CITY DECLARING AN
4	EMERGENCY AS A RESULT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC
5	
6	<u>RECITALS</u>
7	
8	WHEREAS, at its special City Council meeting on March 16, 2020, the City Council
9	heard a report from the City Manager concerning a request to declare an emergency.
10	The conditions identified in the Report by the City Manager are detailed below.
11	
12	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
13	LINCOLN CITY, AS FOLLOWS:
14	
15	SECTION 1. RECITALS . The above recitals are true and correct and are
16	incorporated herein by this reference.
17	
18	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY DECLARATION. The City of Lincoln City does hereby
19	declare a State of Emergency to Exist in the City of Lincoln City, and under the
20	authority of Oregon Revised Statutes, the Lincoln City, City Charter and LCMC Chapter
21	2.72., the City Council does hereby Order as follows:
22	
23	A. A description of the nature of the emergency;
24	The Manager reported that the following conditions have resulted in the need
25	for a declaration of a state of emergency:
26	
27	 COVID-19 was declared a pandemic by the World Health organization on
28	March 11, 2020.
29	 Coronavirus are a group of viruses that can cause respiratory disease, with
30	the potential to cause serious illness or loss of life for individuals with
31	underlying health conditions.
32	 COVID-19 requires a significant amount of resources at the local level to
33	keep the public and community informed and as safe as possible.
34	 On March 8, 2020, Governor Kate Brown declared a state of emergency due
35	to COVID-19 outbreak in Oregon (Executive order No. 20-03), finding that
36	COVID-19 has created a threat to public health and safety, and constitutes
37	a statewide emergency under ORS 401.025(1).
38	 In an Order dated March 12, 2020, Governor Kate Brown provided
39	additional mitigation measures on the Coronavirus Response.

1	6	The unknown duration of the COVID-19 Pandemic will have significant
2	•	financial impact to the community.
3		Pursuant to ORS 401.309(1), the governing body of a city may declare, by
3 . 4	•	Ordinance or Resolution, that a state of Emergency exists within a city.
5		Pursuant to Lincoln City Municipal Code Section 2.72.040, the City Council
6	,	of the City of request may declare an emergency at a regular, special or
7		emergency meeting of the City Council. All declarations must address the
8		required terms as set forth in LCMC 2.72.060.

10	R	The geographic boundaries of the area where the emergency exists as
11	υ.	well as the portions lying within the city's boundaries and areas to be
12		subject to emergency powers/controls:

14		The geographic boundaries of the emergency are:
15		The geographic soundaries of the emergency share
16		The boundaries of the emergency are the city limits of the City of Lincoln
17		City.

19	C.	An estimate of the number of individuals at risk, injured or killed; and
20		
21		The emergency impacts the entire population of the City of Lincoln City,
22		including residents, visitors and the homeless.
23		
24	D.	A description of the actual or likely damage caused by the emergency;
25		and
26		
27		Illness caused by exposure to COVID-19; suffering due to inadequate
28		diagnostic and health care treatment facilities for those infected.
29		
30	E.	A statement of the type of assistance or resources required to respond
31		to the emergency; and
32		
33	•	Reimbursement for salaries, resources, provisions and other expenses
34		incurred by the city in responding to the emergency from federal and state
35		sources.
36	•	Technical assistance from the County Health Department, the State of
37		Oregon and Federal government.
38	•	Provision of emergency supplies from those in need from emergency
39		<u>caches.</u>

1	F.	An estimate of the length of time during which the designated area
2		will remain under the emergency declaration; and
3		
4		Through April 8, 2020, but may be extended by the City Manager without
5		further Order of the Council for two week increments each extension or for
6		increments consistent with State of Oregon emergency declarations.
7		
8	G.	Any special regulations or emergency measures, powers or orders
9		imposed as a result of the declared emergency; and
10		The City Manager, the City Emergency Preparedness Coordinator, and all
11		City Department Heads, and their designees, (hereinafter Designated City
12		Staff) are authorized, without further Order of the City Council to use any
13		and all emergency powers, including those specifically listed in Lincoln City
14	•	Municipal Code [LCMC 2.72.070] to appropriately respond to the
15		emergency and to minimize loss of life.
16		Designated City Staff are to assist in the implementation of any order of the
17		federal government, the Governor, State Public Health Director, or local
18		public health representative related to public health or public health
19		emergency, as directed, pursuant to ORS 431.270, 431.264. 433.411 or
20		401.055, or other applicable statute or order.
21		The Emergency Preparedness Coordinator is expressly authorized to take all
22		actions authorized by law to coordinate the City's response to this
23		emergency, including but not limited to requesting assistance from State,
24		County and Federal authorities.
25		The following emergency powers are as operative, without limitation or
26		prejudice to other authorized powers:
27		All necessary city funds shall be redirected for emergency use, and
28		standard city procurement procedures shall be suspended for any
29		contract or purchase necessary to combat the COVID-19 Pandemic.
30		 Price gouging is prohibited – specifically no person or business may sell
31		or attempt to sell any goods or services for a price in excess of the
32		"normal market price," which shall mean that person's or business's
33		average of the regular price of the goods or services for the 30 days
34		preceding the declaration of the state of emergency.

1	•	All mutual aid agreements are operative and Designated Staff may
2		make application for such emergency assistance as is needed from local,
3		state or federal sources.
4	•	All non-essential City Commissions, Boards, Committees and the like as
5		well as all City Events are cancelled until April 8, 2020. Designated staff
6		may revoke permits for events within the designated emergency period.
7	•	Without further order of the Council, Designated City Staff may restrict,
8		regulate or prohibit vehicular or pedestrian traffic for such distance or
9		degree as may be deemed necessary under the circumstances, including
10		the closing to the public of any or all public places, including streets,
11		alleys, public ways, schools, parks, beaches, amusement areas and
12		public buildings.
13		The City Manager or his designee may establish a curfew during
14		specified hours in specified geographic areas and locations.
15	•	The City Manager or his designee may prohibit or limit the number of
16		persons who may gather or congregate upon any public street, public
17		place, or any outdoor place within the area designated as an emergency
18		<u>area.</u>
19	•	The City Manager or his designee may curtail or suspend commercial
20		<u>activity</u> .
21	•	The City Manager or his designee may designate any developed or
22		undeveloped city property for temporary emergency operations uses,
23		including but not limited to use as an emergency facility, shelter,
24		overnight shelter, bivouac, mess hall, temporary campground, staging
25		area, inoculation center, distribution center, or similar emergency
26		operation uses. Private or other public property may similarly be
27		designated by the city, with the permission of the property owner, for
28		such emergency uses. The duration of such authorized uses is only
29		during the period of the emergency and for a reasonable period of time
30		after the end of the declared emergency.
31	•	The City Manager or his designee may take such other measures [by
32		written order] as are found to be necessary for the protection of life,
33		property, infrastructure, the environment, or for the recovery from the
34		emergency.

35	CECTION 2	. AMENDMENT. This emergency declaration may be amended and
